Overall scenario of the district

Uttar Dinajpur district is situated in the central point of south Bengal. It is surrounded by seven important districts namely enclosed by Panchagarh, Thakurgaon and Dinajpur districts of Bangladesh on the east, Kishanganj, Purnia and Katihar districts of Bihar on the west, Darjeeling district and Jalpaiguri district on the north and Malda district and Dakshin Dinajpur district on the south.

This newly constructed district is preliminarily agricultural in nature. Here, due to its diverse and surplus production of various crops like Tea, Jute, Potato, Ginger, Spices and Pineapple etc. the district has a strong base for agro based and horticulture- based industry.

- ✓ Blocks 9

The district ranks 19th in terms of literacy rate and 13th in terms of sex ratio among all other districts of West Bengal.

In 2006 the Ministry of Panchayati Raj named Uttar Dinajpur one of the country's 250 most backward districts (out of a total of 640). It is one of the eleven districts in West Bengal currently receiving funds from the Backward Regions Grant Fund Programme (BRGF).

District Profile:

Population:

According to Census Data (2011), the Total Population of the district is 30,00,849 out of which there are 15,50,219 males (51.66%) & 14,50,630 females (48.34%). Out of a total 640 districts in India, Hooghly is ranked 124th in terms of population. The population density in the district is 956 persons per sq km.





It has been observed that one of the major sources of water for food processing units in West Bengal is ground water.


Blocks with average depth of ground water more than 4.8 meters during April, 2011 are:

Hence a total of 2026 people are directly involved in the food processing industry for their livelihoods. Out of which 7.80% is female worker.

Investment opportunities:

- ➤ The district ranked 2nd in terms of production of Maize. Maize is one of the major processable cereals. A significant concentration is found in Darjeeling, North Dinajpur, Jalpaiguri, Coochbehar. Hence a new Maize processing unit can be set up in the district.
- > Tulaipanji and Gobindo bhog have got the statutory clearance for export from Ministry of Commerce, Gol. Hence processing and packaging unit for these particular varieties can be set up.
